Declaration of Her Majesty's Government on the transition to neutrality and subsequent Constitution amendment

WHEREAS the Referendum concerning the issue of whether Rabbistan shall transform into a neutral state had been held and supervised by the Referendum and Electoral Affairs Committee, and the results had been presented in *Referendum No 2 Report, October 2018.* The Referendum shows, that 58.9% of participated voters are in favour of the transition.

To practise Constitutional Responsibility, in accordance with the *Referendum and Popular Vote Act, 2009 Cap 2* the Prime Minister's Chancellery (PMC) made an immediate news release on 24 October 2018. On the same day, the League of Micronations (LoMN) approved the transition of Rabbistan from a full member to a non-member observer, and the approval became effective immediately. World National Union (WNU) also recruited Rabbistan as a non-member observer.

After negotiations and consultations within the Cabinet, the Prime Minister issued the *Executive Order 2018 EO 5* for the schedule of work for the transition. Constitution amendment procedures (drafting, consultations, hearings, parliamentary approval, referendum and Royal assent) will start later this year (2018). Major amendments will involve reforms to achieve direct democracy and the amendments to some flaws based on current domestic situations.
